

## **Hog Industry Economic Contribution**


In Oklahoma, 2019 hog production, slaughtering, processing, and related activities made significant contributions to the economy. The sales contributed to Oklahoma's economy from hog production, slaughtering, processing, and related economic activities was estimated at \$5.7 billion in 2019. As shown below, over \$1.3 billion or about 23% of this amount comes from hog production, over \$2.5 billion or 44% from hog slaughtering, and about \$1.9 billion or about 33% from hog processing.


#### State Sales (Output)



Oklahoma's hog production, slaughtering, processing, and related economic activities contributed to more than 34,000 jobs in 2019. Of this total, 13,993 jobs or 41% of the state's hog industry related jobs were contributed by the hog production sector, 12,853 jobs or 37% from hog slaughter, and 7,594 jobs or 22% from hog processing and related.

#### State Jobs





Oklahoma's hog production surpassed 1.5 billion lbs. in 2015, since then, production has trended upward, and in 2019 the state production exceeded 2.0 billion lbs. Oklahoma increased its share of hog production relative to the U.S. total hog production from 4.1% to 5.1% between 2000 and 2019.
